Clytemnestra is an evening length dance theater piece inspired by Aeschylus' Oresteia. Graham tells of the horrible events that precede Clytemnestra's choice to murder her husband, Agamemnon, upon his return home from the Trojan War. Cassandra is but one of many characters; a captive Trojan princess and Agamemnon's mistress, she was doomed by Apollo to prophetize but never to be heeded. In this solo Cassandra agonizes over the murders that are about to happen.
