My goal for Performance Workshop Classes is to give all students the ability to experience as much of Martha's choreography as possible as well as what it feels like to dance the piece. Created during WWII by Graham and Copland in collaboration, Appalachian Spring reflected an optimistic and hopeful imagining of a new life, a new home, and a peaceful, prosperous future in the Pennsylvania spring, when there was "a garden eastward in Eden." The community includes a newly wedded bride and husband, a passionate revivalist preacher, his fervent followers and a wise pioneering woman.

ABOUT THE ARTISTS

MARTHA GRAHAM is recognized as a primal artistic force of the 20th century, alongside Pablo Picasso, James Joyce, Igor Stravinsky, and Frank Lloyd Wright. TIME magazine named Martha Graham "Dancer of the Century," and People magazine named her among the female "Icons of the Century." As a choreographer, she was as prolific as she was complex. Graham created 181 ballets and a dance technique that has been compared to ballet in its scope and magnitude. Her approach to dance and theater revolutionized the art form and her innovative physical vocabulary has irrevocably influenced dance worldwide.

BRADLEY SHELVER Trained at the National School of the Arts in South Africa and at The Ailey School in New York. He has performed with numerous companies worldwide and is in his 15th season with the Metropolitan Opera Ballet. He has created works for: Big Muddy Dance, Graham 2, Ailey 2, Richmond Ballet, Ballet Austin, Cape Town City Ballet, Cedar Lake 2, Royal Danish and Royal Swedish Ballet Schools, Boston Conservatory, and Northern Ballet. He is currently the Artistic Director and resident choreographer for the Joffrey Concert Group.


